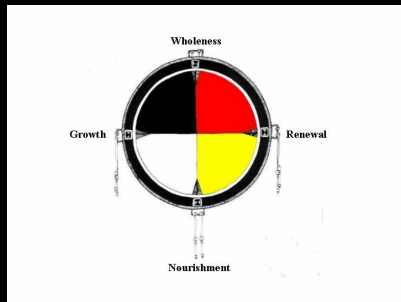


About the Program Coordinator

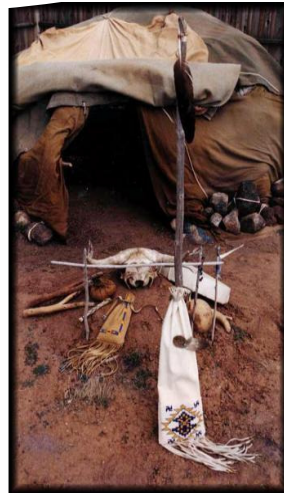

About the Program

The Eagle Lodge is a Sober living home for American Indian Men. Our facility provides a safe and culturally appropriate setting for men who need to develop and maintain a sober lifestyle. The goal of Eagle Lodge is to respond to the drug and alcohol treatment needs of American Indian men. Our commitment is to treat the alcohol and drug user with dignity and respect. Our mission is to empower individuals with the tools necessary to stay Clean & Sober. Our home is an eight bed facility located in downtown Prescott, Arizona. Length of stay is determined by guests needs. Being centrally located we are near, DES, NACOG, 12 step meetings and grocery stores.

The Eagle Lodge provides an Inter-Tribal Culturally specific setting for healing. We have enlisted several Spiritual Leaders from local nations to assist our guests, upon request with their individual Spiritual needs. Our program consists of, Traditional Counseling, Talking Circles, Educa-

tional Groups and community based Native American 12 step meetings. Optional services include: Auricular Acupuncture, Sweat Lodge Ceremonies, Drumming and Singing. If needed our guests may obtain additional Substance Abuse counseling through local outpatient agencies



Admission Guidelines

- Age 18 and over
- No serious medical, psychological or emotional conditions that could interfere with participation in a social-model residential treatment program
- Sincere desire to stop drinking and/ or using drugs.
- Clean and sober for 72 hours prior to admission.
- Openness to a variety of traditional treatment and American Indian traditional healing methods.
- Must submit a copy of the terms and conditions of probation or parole prior to admission.
- Responsible for own groceries and cooking.
